#### Greetings to you all at the House of Faith!

The summer heat wreaks havoc in many different parts of the world. The temperature at Saratoga Springs in Death Valley went up to 129°F on July 17, 2023, only 1°F below the world record. The warmer temperature sparked the wildfires in Canada in late April and has extended from coast to coast. According to Sciencedirect.com, more than 70,000 Europeans died from the heat wave this year. NPR reports, "More hot weather is expected for much of the United States in the coming months.... Driven by a combination of human-caused climate change and the El Niño climate pattern."

To combat the heat wave, I have done a lot of math and science to cool down the sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall more efficiently. Since the new system to bring fresh air from outside was completed last year, the sanctuary remains relatively cool throughout the week. Now the attic fan is turned on Saturday night to bring cool air from outside and runs until 6:20 AM on Sunday morning. This lowers the temperature significantly and allows us to turn on the A/C at 6:30 AM instead of 2:00 AM. A new challenge this year is to keep the usage under Edison's demand rate. When we ran the A/C in the sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall at the same time, we lost the discounted rate last year. Now we run the A/C in the Fellowship Hall for an hour starting at 5:30 AM, and the temperature remains comfortable enough until the A/C comes back on at 10:30 AM. The A/C usage in the sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall are staggered, and only run for about 15 minutes concurrently. This should help us to stay below the demand level and get the discounted rate back.

The good news is that even under the new rate, our electric bill has been just over several hundred so far this year and we have built a credit of about \$1200. This may go down over the summer, but it will still help our bottom line. We used to have a budget of \$14,000 for electricity before installing solar panels, and it is now only \$1,200. Last year we paid "zero dollars" for our main electric bill. More good news is that after installing timers on two water heaters, the gas bill has decreased to \$130, saving the church about \$3000/year. We used to heat the water heaters all the time, but now can turn it on just when we are there.

If my memory serves me right, (do not worry, my brain still works most of the time), Al and Jan came to us shortly after I began serving the church. Jan moved to Yucaipa before her retirement from the county of Los Angeles in Santa Clarita. Jan's sister Laurena and Laurena's husband Harold retired soon after and moved right next door to Jan. Laurena said to me that as soon as she stepped into the sanctuary, she knew in her spirit that she had come to her home church. The two couples traveled the world together and have done more than 40 cruises. Harold and Al went to be with the Lord after having dealt with health issues. Jan fell in her sleep and suffered a brain hemorrhage early this year, but by the grace of God, fully recuperated. Through hospitalization and recovery, Laurena took very good care of Jan. Several months ago, Laurena suffered an infection, which caused a lot of pain and hospitalization. It was Jan's turn to take care of Laurena, and she did it so lovingly. Laurena was recovering steadily, but her family made the decision to move her closer to her daughter, and Jan accompanied Laurena. We are going to miss Jan and Laurena and their hugging each other after worship every Sunday morning. We wish them Godspeed. Here is their new address:



# Christmas Shoe Boxes for Children


