

Bible Study: The Practices of Prayer with Rev. Dr. Deena Barwick on Zoom

Mondays in June: 3, 10, 17 and 24 from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm Pacific Time

Why do we pray? What do we pray for? When and where do we do it? And perhaps the most interesting question – how do we pray? How do we know if we have received the 'correct' answers for the focus of our prayers? Praying to a gracious God is very, very personal. Many of us think that public prayers are something we can't do as well as others. So why do we pray? Because it is the most important communication we have with our Lord. I am sure that each of you have your favorite way to pray and feel uncomfortable when you are asked to engage in a "different way of praying". How much do you really know about prayer techniques or practices? Would you like to know more? This four-week on-line Bible Study class is being offered to those who want to dig deeper into different practices of prayer. We will learn to listen to and value our inner knowing, that part of us that is informed by all we have experienced so far. We will experience and learn new ways of listening for the still, small voice of God through the art of prayer. *Sign-up details and instructions for the class will be available soon!*

Greetings to all you faithful at the House of Faith!

As I wrote in my letter last month, American missionaries in Korea were influential in sending the first Korean immigrants to the US. I want to share the story of a very prominent American missionary who is held in the highest esteem among Korean Methodists. Henry Gerhard Appenzeller, a man with total dedication to the Gospel, came to Korea, where Buddhism and Confucianism had been the dominant religions for millennia. Despite Christianity being regarded as a religion of the West and Christians being persecuted and sentenced to capital punishment, Appenzeller fearlessly came and woke the nation from its long spiritual slumber. John Wesley is the founder of worldwide Methodism, but Henry Appenzeller is the founder of Methodist Church in Korea, which now boasts a membership of 1.5 million only after 130 years of history.

Henry Appenzeller was born in Souderton, Pennsylvania, on February 6, 1858. His mother was a Swiss Mennonite, and his father was a fourth-generation Pennsylvania Dutchman. German Reformed faith was the norm around the area. His mother significantly influenced him and would gather him with his two brothers on Sunday afternoons to read from the German Bible. She spoke very little English, and Henry spoke only "Pennsylvania German" until he was twelve. Henry used German all his life, even with Germans in Korea.



Henry learned the Heidelberg Catechism, which emphasizes personal faith. The Catechism covers the basic tenets of the Christian faith with questions and answers. His father did not give Henry and his sons infant baptism but waited until they made the affirmation of faith on their own. When Henry was eighteen, the Presbyterian Church hosted a series of special services with an evangelist. On October 6, 1876, Henry had a deeply personal spiritual experience and celebrated that date each year as his spiritual birthday.

He attended Franklin and Marshall College, rooted in the Reformed Church. During his college years, he found class meetings at First Methodist Episcopal Church attractive and soon decided to join the church. Henry felt more at home with the Methodists than in the Reformed Church. Henry joined the First Church and became an assistant pastor while still in college and felt a call to foreign missions. He wrote in his diary, "The ambition of my life is to spend it entirely in the service of the Lord." During college, he met Ella Dodge, from Berlin, New York. She was a devout Christian and a descendant of William Dodge, who emigrated from Chester, England, to Salem, Massachusetts, in 1629. As she fell in love with Henry, she became an eager partner in the common call to cross the sea and serve Christ. Before joining the First Church, she had been brought up as a Baptist.

After graduating from Franklin and Marshall College in 1882, Henry entered Drew Theological Seminary to prepare for pastoral ministry. Drew was an exciting place for Henry's keen mind and spirit. A part of the excitement came from the rapidly expanding global missionary movement of the late 19th century. Henry caught the spirit and applied to the Board of Foreign Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church for service in Japan. The Board had no opening there, but decided in late 1884 to open a new field in Korea. Korea was "the Hermit Nation" and had just signed a treaty with the US that encouraged friendship and commerce, but lacked a religious freedom clause. On December 20, 1884, the Board of Foreign Missions finally decided to send Henry and his bride, Ella, to Korea. They joined a previously selected missionary doctor, William B. Scranton. Henry and Ella got on the Good Ship Arabic with Scranton and his wife, daughter, and mother and set out across the Pacific. The story continues.




Buy Stater's Scrip Cards!
