Our church had much to celebrate at our annual Charge Conference on December 6. Even though we are a small congregation, we once again undertook various capital improvement projects. Again, thanks to enthusiastic volunteers and grants, we successfully completed them at a fraction of the cost.

The annual budget of \$315,705 for 2025 has been adopted and approved. The new budget reflects minimal operational costs. Many of you may not know that our annual budget ten years ago was around \$365,000. If we had not significantly reduced expenses, it would have exceeded \$400,000 by now, and the funds in the Foundation would have declined to an unsustainable level for our needs. As you have observed, we have carefully managed our finances and sought to cut expenses as much as possible without compromising the church's ministries. Our financial effectiveness is yet another area of success that we celebrate.

I am very happy that we received seven new members last year. The church is a community of faith that gathers together. We have the most beautiful church campus, but we cannot be the church without people. I am grateful that God has blessed our church with new members, and I pray for God's continued blessings to add even more to our church family.

The Trustees have completed their evaluation of the prospects for hosting the daycare program of the Renu Hope Foundation and made revisions to the draft lease. Renu Hope has been diligently working with contractors to provide the overall cost of renovating the Education Building to the State. They recently discovered that constructing a new kitchen in the Education Building exceeds their anticipated budget, as it requires new plumbing, fire sprinklers, and appliances. Therefore, they have requested to also lease our kitchen in the Fellowship Hall. They operate daycare programs in other churches and are aware of our church's occasional use for weddings, funerals, and other events. The church's usage of the kitchen, when necessary, will take priority so it will not pose a problem. This additional use will generate more revenue than what they initially proposed. We are waiting for the final lease draft, which still needs to be approved by Trustees, the District Superintendent, and the District Committee on Buildings. After securing the District's approval, our church will hold another Charge Conference to give it the final stamp of approval. Please pray that everything goes smoothly and the lease begins to generate revenue.

Four technicians, including two from So Cal Gas Company, came to examine the broken furnace in the Fellowship Hall. They diagnosed the issue as a malfunctioning gas valve but were unable to fix it. I have yet to meet with another technician who has worked with ancient furnaces like ours. In the meantime, we are turning on the small furnace in the Matthews Room early Sunday morning and keep the partitions open to allow hot air to flow into the Hall. Thankfully, it heats the Hall very comfortably for fellowship.

The year 2024 was a blessed year, and we welcome the New Year with the hope of continued blessings from our good and faithful Lord. None of us knows what the new year will bring apart from a few facts. The world will keep spinning swiftly, resulting in many uncertainties. Therefore, we must rely humbly on God for guidance and protection. Another certainty is that God will take good care of us, and we will witness God's new mercies during the New Year. I can testify to this truth through my experiences at the House of Faith over the past ten years. God has been incredibly gracious to all of us year after year.




Buy Stater's Scrip Cards!
