

Pentecost sunday is june 8 - Wear red!



Pentecost is observed on the seventh Sunday after Easter. It celebrates the arrival of the Holy Spirit into the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ, as told in Acts 2:1-31.

The day of Pentecost is recognized as the birthday of the church. Guided by Peter's preaching, many thousands were converted in Jerusalem on that day.

Warm greetings to the families at the House of Faith!

I have a few records from my four decades of parish ministry. I served a small congregation in Boston, which was the most ethnically diverse with nine or more different nationalities, in the New England Annual Conference. In Westbrook, Maine, I presided over funerals on four consecutive Saturdays. Although we celebrate life at the end of our journey, I found myself emotionally drained. During my time there, I welcomed about 45 new members in two years. The district superintendent was skeptical, as church growth in old New England congregations was quite rare, so I sent him a letter listing all the names. In Riverside, I covered nine visitations in a single day. I hadn't planned it, of course; usually, one or two visits a day are sufficient, but it just happened. I was so busy that I forgot to change the oil in my car for 18,000 miles, and my car died. A lesson, and now I try to perform oil changes regularly. One year, I drove over 55,000 miles. Arlington UMC gained 99 new members during my tenure and was once the fastest-growing congregation in the Riverside District. The longest tenure before I arrived in Yucaipa was nine years in Arlington. I broke my record here and will complete my 10th consecutive appointment at the end of June. Lord willing, when I return in July, I will set the record in the church's history as the longest-serving pastor.

I am truly humbled by all of this and give all the glory to the good Lord who has been so faithful not only to me but also to the churches I have served. I also want to thank my family for supporting my ministry, especially with financial help for some significant upgrades. Over the past ten years, I have tackled many projects, all of which God has abundantly blessed. I shared with you that all the capital improvements have an insurance value of \$650,000. Renu Hope has added a plan for an additional playground, which has increased their renovation cost. One playground will cost over \$65,000. I estimate that they will need to spend over \$300,000 on all the renovations. Now, the total capital improvement of the church will reach close to or over a million dollars. The new revenue from the lease will provide the church with significant financial benefits for many years, hopefully even decades to come. Thanks be to God!


